PURPOSE

Briar Hill Primary School is a Steiner influenced school which acknowledges the importance of play. We strive to create a warm and nurturing environment where play evolves through imagination. This policy is for teachers, parents, children and school administrators to have a consistent, collaborative understanding of the school's direction/handling of toys within the school grounds during school time.

POLICY

We aim to create a nourishing and home-like environment for the children. The school classroom provides the children with a wide range of natural, materials in a variety of textures and colours. These include raw, unfinished materials, such as wood, shells, cloths, wool, baskets, cushions, wooden bowls, pots and utensils. We believe natural toys cultivate imagination and connection with the environment.

The school encourages collaborative play outside with natural materials and items on the list below including Sports equipment e.g. footballs, basketballs and play pod items. The children are also supplied with equipment for sandpits such as pots and pans and small shovels.

In order to foster the Steiner influence philosophy, cultivate imagination and avoid conflict, loss or damage, we ask that toys are not brought from home. Teachers and school administrators will ensure that toys brought from home are kept in bags until the end of the day.

Some toys may be involved in working with a child's individual learning plan (ILP) or are needed for transitional comforters and these will be addressed on an individual basis.
